Petr Šrenk, DVM, Dipl ECVN  
Czech Republic



Dr. Šrenk graduated as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (MVDr) from the University of Veterinary Medicine in Brno in 1990 and continued with a Postgraduate study at Clinic of Small Animals and Horses, UVM Brno. In October 1991 he started his Residency Training Program in Neurology, which he completed in June 1994 at the same time as he graduated also as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from the University of Bern, Switzerland. He returned to Brno as an Assistant Professor at the Clinic of Small Animal Internal Medicine, University of Veterinary and Pharmaceutical Sciences. From June to September 1995, Dr. Šrenk was a supervisor at the Institute of Clinical Neurology, University of Bern, Switzerland and in the same year he also passed the Board examinations and became a Diplomate of European College of Veterinary Neurology (DECVN). He continued as a supervisor at the Institute of Clinical Neurology, University of Bern, Switzerland from November 1996 to February 1997, before he returned to Czech Republic and joined a Referral Clinic - Klinika Jaggy in Brno, and later also in Prague, as a neurologist. From 2000 to 2014, Dr. Šrenk was also a Veterinary Technical Manager at PG PETCARE. Dr. Šrenk is a recipient of IAMS and Karl Pfizer Awards and has been a lecturer at over 100 meetings throughout the Europe.

Tommaso Pilla, DVM, PhD  
Italy/Slovenia



Dr. Pilla graduated from the Veterinary Faculty of Padova in 2006 and continued with a postgraduate internship focusing on veterinary anesthesia. Between 2009 and 2011 he visited the clinics of the Universities of Bern (Switzerland) and Utrecht (Netherlands) and some of the largest specialist veterinary centres in Europe to improve his skills in anesthesia and intensive care medicine. In 2011 he was awarded a PhD in anesthesia and analgesia with a research on propofol pharmacokinetic and target controlled infusion systems in cats. Dr. Pilla joined Animal Hospital Postojna in February 2011 running the anaesthesia service. He is particularly interested in the physiology and pharmacology of anaesthetics, total intravenous anaesthesia and loco-regional anaesthetic techniques. Dr. Pilla gradually developed an interest for CT imaging - he was cofounder and partner in a veterinary diagnostic imaging center in Italy between 2013 and 2018 and he is now running the CT service at the Animal Hospital Postojna. He is also a lecturer for the continuing education courses of the Italian Companion Animal Veterinary Association (SCIVAC) and has been lecturing at national and international congresses, and has authored several scientific papers.

Marko Pipan, DVM, Dipl ACVECC  
Slovenia



After graduating from the Veterinary Faculty at the University of Ljubljana, Dr. Pipan continued with his quest for a quality veterinary medicine at the University of Ljubljana, University of Utrecht and University of Pennsylvania. After a 3-year clinical residency in emergency and critical care (ECC) in USA, he successfully passed a certification exam and became a board-certified specialist of the American College of Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care (Dipl. ACVECC) and thereby one of the first internationally recognized specialists in clinical veterinary medicine for small animals in Slovenia. In the last years, Dr. Pipan is actively involved in lecturing about emergency and critical care medicine in Slovenia and abroad. He worked and consulted in England, Malaysia, Germany and Austria. As a chair of a Local organizing committee he organized a very successful 15<sup>th</sup> EVECC Congress in Ljubljana, Slovenia in 2016. Dr. Pipan has been working in Animal Hospital Postojna for years. His main area of interest are critical patients, but he is also actively engaged in anesthesia and diagnostic imaging procedures (i.e. ultrasound, x-rays, computed tomography) with a special interest in CT imaging.
